Short Introduction:

The quantity of materials in Japanese about Chinese history and culture is immense, far more than anyone can read in a lifetime. The aim of this workshop will be to introduce the general contours of this edifice of materials. Prof. Josh Fogel will lecture on the historical background to the various schools of Japanese Sinology, introduce the major library reference works and how to use them, and read at least one text together.

Joshua Fogel is professor of history and East Asian studies at the University of California, Santa Barbara. He has written extensively on the history of Japanese Sinology and Sino-Japanese relations, and he is the founding editor of the journal "Sino-Japanese Studies".
